Did you ever imagine recycled turbine blades could be turned into functional art? One of our recycling partners, Canvus, is making it a reality! When it's time to replace worn, outdated blades with new, more efficient ones, Canvus works to combine the fiberglass from old wind turbine blades with other materials – also largely recycled – to create unique street furniture from public seating, to planters, to signage and more. To date, MidAmerican has sent Canvus more than 550 blades to be repurposed into thousands of products.
