SPR SAFETY INTO ELECTRICAL SAFETY

May is National Electrical Safety Month. Use these tips to stay safe around electricity:

- Avoid overloading outlets and circuits. Spread electrical devices out across outlets in your home or business.
- > Check electrical cords for fraying or cracked plastic coating. Unplug and replace damaged cords.
- > Call 811 to have utilities marked before digging, even in your own yard. Digging to plant trees, install fences or put up a swing set can lead to disaster if you hit unmarked underground gas or power lines.
- > Keep electrical cords and appliances like phones chargers, hair dryers and power tools away from water. Unplug these small appliances when not in use to save energy and free up outlets.
- > Never approach downed power lines. Always assume that power lines are live and dangerous.
- > Use your circuit box to turn off power to areas in your home or business before beginning any improvement projects.

Trees and branches that come into contact with power lines can be safety hazards and disrupt your service. As part of our Safety Through Asset Reliability (STAR) initiative, we regularly perform routine tree maintenance along our power lines that balances preserving trees and protecting our lines. If we need to prune trees in your area, we'll send you a letter notifying you several weeks in advance before work even begins.

For your safety, do not try to remove trees or tree limbs on or near power lines. If you see growth too close to a power line, our certified arborists will clear it free of charge. Submit a tree trimming request by calling 888-427-5632 or visiting
